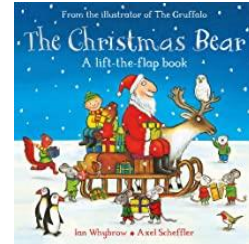
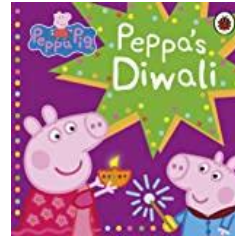


What should I already know?

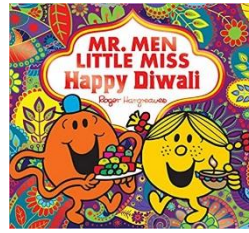

Mehndi	A form of body art usually drawn on hands or legs

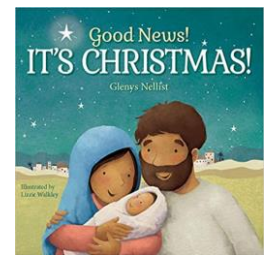
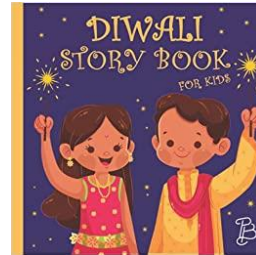

Guy Fakes	Involved in the gunpowder plot. A conspiracy to assassinate King James VI and the houses of parliament
Christ	Jesus of Nazareth
