



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

What we do at school...

Children will become settled into school routines and key worker groups, They will put their belongings away, for example, coat and water bottle. Children will be encouraged access resources independently and tidy them away. Children will be encouraged to take turns and share.

How you can help

Encourage your child to tidy away their toys at home.
Encourage your child to take turns at home.

Literacy

What we do at school...

We will share books and stories. Children will be encouraged to ascribe meaning to the marks they make. Children will begin phase one letters and sounds. They will listen carefully to the sounds they hear, for example, going on a sound walk and thinking about rhyme and rhythm in words.

How you can help

Encourage your child to listen to sounds carefully.
Ask your child about their drawings.
Share reading books with your child.

Physical Development

What we do at school...

Children will be learning 'Kinetic Letter movements', strong gorilla, stone lion. Children will be encouraged to use actions when singing Nursery Rhymes. Children will be encouraged to manage their own personal hygiene e.g. washing their hands and going to the toilet.

How you can help

Encourage independence with your child's toileting needs.

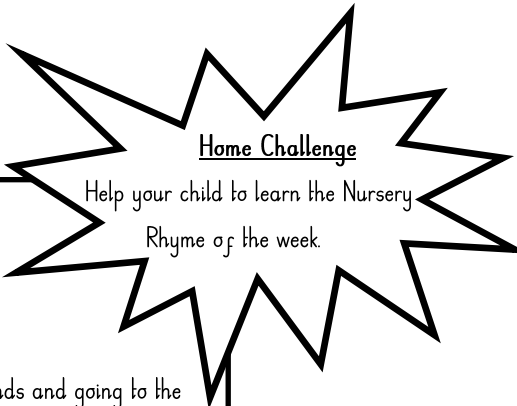
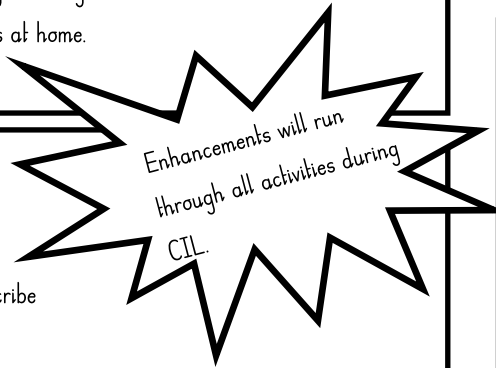
Understanding the World

What we do at school...

Children will explore water and pipes. Children will go on sound walks.

How you can help

Talk to your child about what they see on their way to Nursery. What sounds can you hear along the way?
Take your child to the park and talk about what they can hear and see. Link these to initial sounds, for example 'ppp pinecone.'



Communication and Language

What we do at school...

Children will be encouraged join in with Nursery Rhymes, Twinkle Twinkle, Miss Polly had a Dolly, Jack and Jill and Humpty Dumpty Children will be encouraged to answer questions with more than yes/no answers.

How you can help

Encourage your child to sing Nursery Rhymes at home.
Ask children questions that can not be answered with yes or no answers.

Expressive Arts and Design

What we do at school...

Sing Nursery Rhymes and explore different media based on these Nursery Rhymes, for example cutting humpty dumpty out and sticking him back together again with plasters.

How you can help

Provide materials and resources for your child to explore and create pictures at home.

Mathematics

What we do at school...

Children will sing number rhymes. Children will be counting objects, showing amounts of numbers on their fingers and recognising numbers first to 5 and then to 10. Children will be talking about the shape of every day objects.

How you can help

Count all objects! Stairs, jumps, toys, everything. Encourage your child to show an interest in shapes in the environment. Praise your child for saying number names correctly in play.
